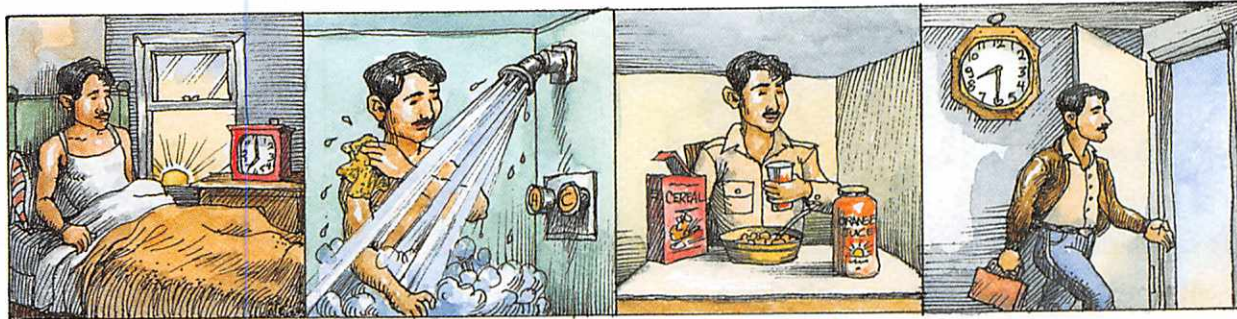

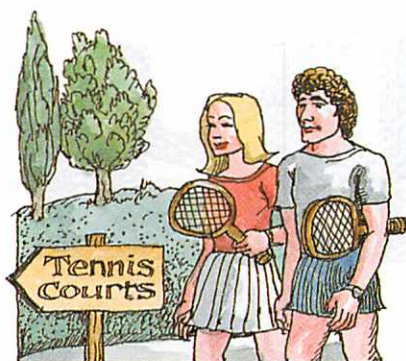
Yesterday Suzi **went** to the market and **bought** some apples.



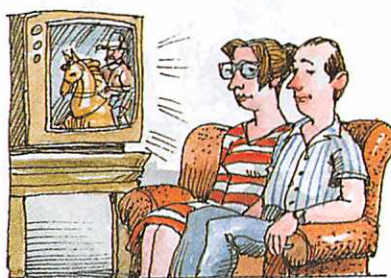
Last night Peter and Maria **went** to the Rex Theater and **saw** a movie.



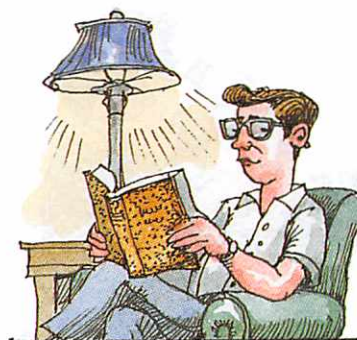
Yesterday afternoon Linda **went** to the library and **studied**.



This morning Barbara and Tino **went** to the park and **played** tennis.



Last night Mr. and Mrs. Golo **stayed** home and **watched** TV.



Last Saturday Johnnie **stayed** home and **read** a book.

SIMPLE PAST Regular Verbs

play – played	walk – walked
stay – stayed	watch – watched
talk – talked	work – worked

SIMPLE PAST Irregular Verbs

go – went	have – had
buy – bought	read – read
do – did	see – saw

Regular verbs end in -ed.

For a list of irregular verbs, see the appendix.

PAIR WORK • Ask and answer questions. Use past time expressions like **yesterday**, **yesterday afternoon**, **last night**, **this morning**, **last Saturday**.

- A: **What did you do last night?**
 B: **I went to the Rex Theater and saw a movie. What about you?**
 A: **I stayed home and read a book.**
 OR **I didn't do anything.**

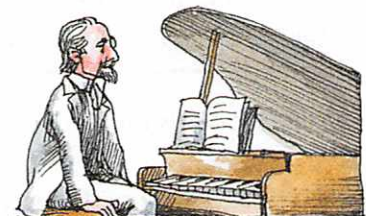

B: I'm going to study at the library. OR I'm going to see my friends.

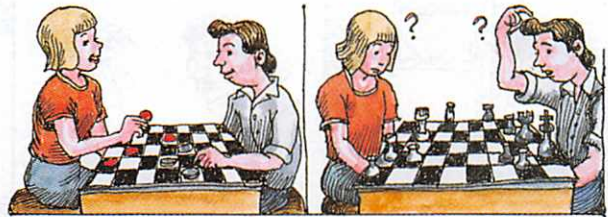
STRUCTURE • CAN

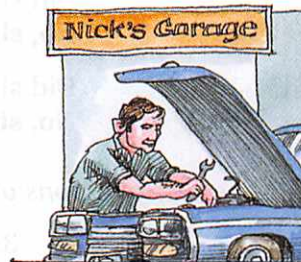

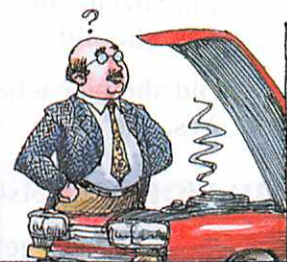
